**Regulations for Bachelor's Degree Studies,  
Suranaree University of Technology, (No. 2)  
B.E. 2555 (2012)**

It has been found appropriate to amend the Suranaree University of Technology regulations for Bachelor's Degree Studies regarding the admission to an additional Bachelor's degree program. Accordingly, by the virtue of section 16 (2) of Suranaree University of Technology Act of B.E. 2533 (1990), endowed with the Suranaree University of Technology Council's resolution in the 7<sup>th</sup>/2554 (2011) meeting on 24 December 2554 (2011), the regulations are thereby set out as follow:

- Section 1** These regulations are called "Regulations for Bachelor's Degree Studies, Suranaree University of Technology, (No. 2), B.E. 2555 (2012)"
- Section 2** These regulations enter into force from the 3<sup>rd</sup> trimester of 2554 (2011) academic year onward.
- Section 3** Exclusively for those who have received bachelor degree from the School of Transportations at the University who also wish to study an additional bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering, these regulations are enforced instead of Section 9 in Regulations for Bachelor's Degree Studies, Suranaree University of Technology, B.E. 2546 (2003), as stated below:
- "Section 9 Application to study for an additional Bachelor's Degree
- 9.1 Those who have graduated with a bachelor's degree from the University may apply for another bachelor's degree program
- 9.2 On applying, a request is to be submitted to the Center for Education Service for no later than 30 days before the trimester. If it is less than 30 days before the trimester, an approval from the Chair of the School to which the student is applying must be obtained.

- 9.3 Deliberation on and approval of admitting the applicant into the program, substitutable courses or transferred courses needed in addition as well as the duration of the study will be made by the Institute Committee, provided the recommendation from the Chair of the School to which the student is applying.
- 9.4 Courses considered substitutable are those taken by the student and in which the grades of no less than 'C' or equivalent are earned, while the grades earned for the transferred courses must be no less than 'D'.
- 9.5 Substituting and transferred courses must be in the program from which the student has graduated for no more than 1 year or that is approved by the Institute Committee.
- 9.6 Additional courses needed to be studied must be no less than 26 credits”
